

TRAVEL INFORMATION FOR VIENNA

Travel to/from the Airport

BY BUS: The Vienna Airport line has a 7-day service from and to the airport and departs at regular intervals between 05:30 and midnight. Cost: approx. €6, -, duration: approx. 30-45 minutes.

Departures:

Schwedenplatz: 30-minute intervals (red & green line/U1&U4)

Westbahnhof (orange line/U3) and Südbahnhof (tram D)

BY TRAIN: The CAT (city airport train) has a 7-day service and leaves every 30 minutes between 05:37 and 23:07. Cost: €8, - one-way / €15, - return, duration: 16 minutes.

Departure: Wien Mitte (Landstraße/U4&U3)

The 7-day "Schnellbahn" service leaves at 10- to 30-minute intervals between 05:00 and 22:00.

Cost: approx. €3, -, duration: approx. 30 minutes.

Departure: Floridsdorf (U6&S15), Wien Mitte (Landstraße/U3&U4)

BY TAXI: Average fare from the Airport to central Vienna between €30, - and €40, -.

Public transport in Vienna

The best way to visit Vienna's sights and discover the city on your own is by public transport: underground, trams, buses and rapid transit.

The congress venue has easy access to the underground system. Underground line U2 (purple line) stops at „Schottentor“ where the venues of the EEA-ESEM 2006 conference are only very few steps away. All hotels can easily be reached by public transport too.

Public transport tickets/prices:

24-hour ticket €5,00











72-hour ticket €12,00

Single tickets €1,50

These tickets are available at the ticket sales offices of the Vienna Transport Authority, at tobacconists and from vending machines in the underground stations; the 72-hour season ticket is also available in the *Tourist Information Office* (1., Albertinaplatz, daily 9 am - 7 pm). Single tickets are also available from the vending machines in the vehicles themselves (including single-ticket surcharge they cost 2,00 Euro, have coins ready!).

Children under six always travel free, children under 15 on Sundays and public holidays and during the school holidays (identity card as proof of age!). There are reasonably priced "two-trip tickets for seniors" for women over 60 and men over 65 (passport or ID required) - purchase your ticket before you set off from a tobacconist or any ticket machine in a subway station.

Bear in mind that taking the underground is much faster, safer, and more reliable than catching a taxi.
